The following has been reported to date:

Dalton #1267.

We are asking all members to use the upmost precautions during this time of health issue. The Coronavirus level in our area is still very low. This is a constantly evolving situation, but as of today, there are no reports of the virus in our community. We are engaging in numerous other measures to prevent Coronavirus from reaching our lodge. Cleaning routines have been adjusted so that common areas are being sanitized multiple times. We ask that if you are not feeling well, please stay home in consideration of our other members.

We will continue to monitor the Coronavirus situation and evaluate additional measures to support our members.

Lake Oconee #2849.

The House Committee and restaurant staff are performing additional cleaning procedures using the guidelines recommended by the CDC. The dance and dinner for this coming Friday has been canceled but the lodge remains open.

Sent to all members by email:

For as long as the Lodge is to remain open, we want to emphasize the extreme importance of good personal hygiene and careful, cautious, reasoned behaviour to all Elks:

Wash your hands frequently with soap and water.
Use hot water, lather-up and then scrub for twenty seconds.
Scrub your nails in the palm of the opposite hand,
ensure that lathering and scrubbing extends over the wrists.
Reciting your ABCs (INCLUDING "now I've sung my ABCs...") while washing is the minimum amount of time necessary to ensure clean hands.

Avoid touching your face: eyes, ears, nose and mouth.

Maintain a personal space of 6 feet. This means even the elbow to elbow greeting places you and your greeted friend in the zone of transmission.

Refrain from the direct contact of hugging, shaking hands, fist bumping and / or high fiving.

Whatever personal allowance you make for yourself, this is <u>not</u> the opportunity to share it.

It is cold and flu season to begin with. Those members that are not feeling tip-top, <u>please</u> <u>stay home</u>. Is your spouse or signicant or parent or child not feeling tip-top? <u>Please stay home</u>.

The situation is very fluid and we expect that this week, with wider testing available, we will have more information.

Augusta #205.

Last night was the Special Needs Prom at the Lodge which was, in fact, held. They have cancelled their next dance and it is Patrisia's expectation that the leadership is going to curtail activity. They are meeting today via SMS text messaging.

Covington #1806

Covington looked at the average age of the Members. They have an average age of participating Elks of 74 years old. Exalted Ruler Myers looked at the county's actions – closing everything, no large gatherings in the community. Chuck felt as though they needed to follow suit and not be ignorant of the community threat. Chuck also was concerned about bad public relations that might result from an "outbreak" within the Lodge. They are also promoting back to the community that they are all in this together. Meetings, bingo, dances, St Paddy's, all social events shut down. The Lodge will be deep-cleaning during the next two weeks
